

## What's New in Year 2

Understanding the shift from Year 1 to Year 2 can help you support your child as they grow in confidence and independence. Here's what to expect:

### **III** Curriculum & Learning

- •**Year 1**: Focuses on transition from Reception, building confidence with phonics, number basics, and classroom routines.
- •Year 2: Consolidates skills and stretches children's thinking. This is the final year of Key Stage 1.

#### Reading & Writing

- •Year 1: Children learn to decode words using phonics and write short sentences.
- •Year 2: Reading becomes more fluent with stronger comprehension. Writing develops into longer, structured pieces with punctuation, grammar, and joined handwriting.

#### **+** Maths

- •Year 1: Focus on number bonds, counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s, simple addition and subtraction.
- •Year 2: Moves on to multiplication/division facts (2, 5, 10), simple fractions, place value to 100, and more problem-solving.

#### 🤝 Social & Emotional Development

- •Year 1: Adjusting to routines, developing confidence in the classroom.
- •Year 2: Growing in confidence, collaborating with peers, and often taking on small leadership roles.
- **✓ Key Message for Parents:** Year 2 brings higher expectations, but it is still about nurturing enjoyment in learning. Teachers keep activities engaging and supportive, while preparing children for Key Stage 2.



## **Curriculum Overview**

#### Term 1

### Topic: We Are Going to the Zoo

This term, our learning will be linked to the theme of zoos and animals. Children will explore the topic through a wide range of subjects, building curiosity and making connections across their learning.

### **Core Subjects**

- •English Reading and writing activities linked to animals and zoo adventures.
- •Maths Developing number knowledge, problem-solving, and using maths in real-life contexts.
- •Science Animals and their Habitats: Exploring where different animals live and why.

### **Foundation Subjects**

- •History The history of zoos and animals in circuses.
- •Art Working with different materials, with a focus on creating clay pots.
- •Computing What is a computer? Introduction to technology and its uses.
- •**PE** Developing physical skills, teamwork, and movement.
- •**PSHE** Learning about ourselves, friendships, and making good choices.
- •RE Believing: Who is Jewish and what do they believe?

# **Homework Expectations**

- **Lang** Daily Reading
- •RWI (Read Write Inc.) children → 2 books:
  - 1.A phonics book (via Oxford Owl).
  - 2.A book for pleasure.
- 'Off scheme' children → use the Accelerated Reader Programme, choosing books from school and completing quizzes in school.
- friedling reading records to school every Friday, signed by an adult.
- Comments about your child's reading are always welcome.

(A reminder that this is a reading record, not a contact book.)

### **Weekly Practice**

- •KS2 (Years 3-6): Times tables → TTRS (Times Tables Rock Stars)
- •KS1 (Years 1-2): Number skills → *Numbots*
- •All children: Spelling
- Regular practice at home really supports your child's learning thank you for your support!

## **Accelerated Reader**

During Term 1, all children will be issued logins to access the **Accelerated Reader (AR) program**.

#### **STAR Reading Test:**

- Each child will take a STAR Reader test to determine their individual reading level.
- Each reading level is associated with a specific **colour**, which helps guide book selection.

#### **Library Visits & Book Selection:**

- Children will visit our library pod to choose a book that matches their colour level.
- Our library is arranged by colour to make it quick and easy for children to find a suitable book.
- Children will take their chosen book home along with a **reading record**.
- The reading record can be used at home to document every time your child reads, not just their AR book.

#### **AR Book Quizzes:**

- Once a child finishes their AR book, they can take an online quiz to check their understanding.
- Quizzes can be taken at home once we provide the logins and links.
- Children who achieve a perfect score (5/5) can add a leaf to our **reading tree**.
- At the end of the year, the child with the most leaves will receive a prize.

#### **Checking Reading Records:**

Reading records will be checked every Friday before the children visit the library to change their books.
 We encourage parents to support their children's reading at home to help them build confidence and develop a love of reading.
