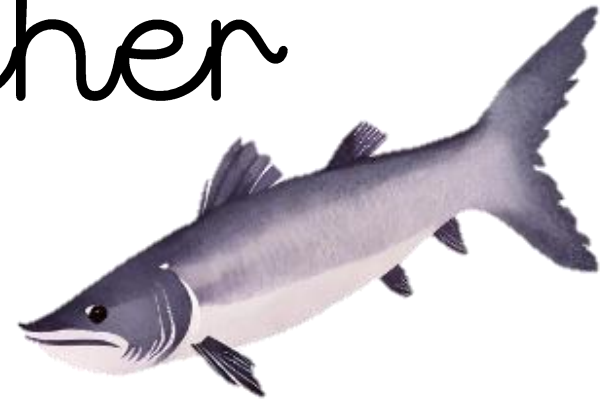
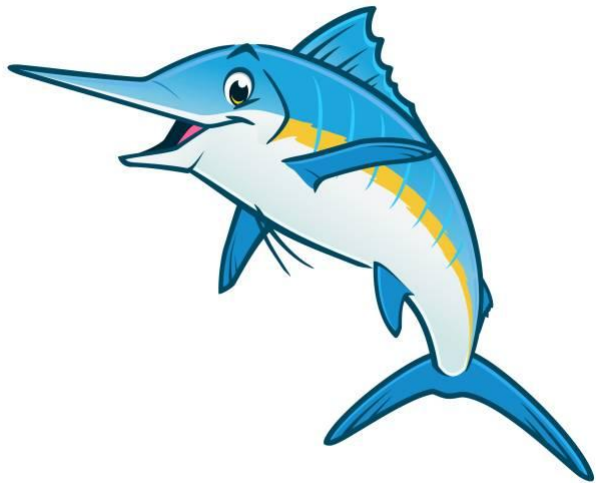

Maroon/red check summer dresses may be worn in summer terms.

PE kit



Please ensure your child comes to school in their correct school PE kit on PE days. PE kit consists of:

- All black t shirt and sweatshirt/hoodie (plain or with school logo)
- All black joggers/leggings/shorts
- Black or white trainers.



All jewellery must be removed unless for religious/cultural reasons.

Homework



In order to help prepare them for secondary school, in year 6, children are given homework in maths, reading and grammar. This will be completed ONLINE via Spelling Shed and Times Tables Rockstars.

Reading

Children will be able to select a reading book in line with their Accelerated Reader level. They should aim to read for 20 minutes a day, which can be any book they choose. Depending on your child's strength in reading, this doesn't have to be to an adult, though some children may benefit from this.



Once children have completed a book, they should do a quiz. If they pass (60%+) , they receive tickets for our class termly raffle to win a prize.

Behaviour

A reflection form filled in after a behaviour incident and logged with behaviour lead Miss Wright.

If children have 3 behaviour incidents resulting in a reflection form in one term, they are then put on report.

The behaviour report has tailored targets and children choose a staff member to be their check-in person every day.

If children meet their targets consistently for two weeks, they can come off this.

If children have continuing behaviour incidents, consequences can be escalated proportionally.

Absence



If your child will be absent from school due to sickness, you should inform the school office by phone or Arbor on the first day of absence. On each subsequent day of absence, you should call the school office to inform them your child is still absent.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they should be off school for 48 hours from their last bout.

Wherever possible, please try to book appointments outside of school hours.



Medical conditions

The school can only give medication that is prescribed by a doctor, if a dose is required during the school day. This should be brought to the school office so that relevant paperwork can be filled in.

If your child has a medical condition, including asthma or allergies or any kind, the school office should be made aware and the appropriate medication brought in for them.

Parent/carer consent and contact information

When your child joined the school, you would have filled in information regarding your contact details and any relevant permissions including emergency medical consent and photo permissions.

It is vital that our records are as up to date as possible, so please ensure you have informed the office if you have changed address/phone number etc.

Contact

If you need to contact me, please do so via message on Class Dojo.

If there are any last minute changes to collection arrangements, this is best provided to the school office (01322 226891) so they can ensure the adult in class gets the message by home time.



Collection

Children should be collected promptly at 3:25. If your child is not collected on time, they can be collected from the school office when you arrive.

Treasure Chest must be pre-booked due to staffing ratios, children cannot be put into Treasure Chest if their parent or carer is late collecting them.

Walking home

During year 6, many parents choose to allow their child to begin to walk to and from school themselves.

If you would like your child to walk home alone, please send either a dojo message or note detailing which days they are to be released alone.

If your child is walking home alone, they may bring their phone to school. However, this should be turned off upon entering the school building and given to their class teacher.
